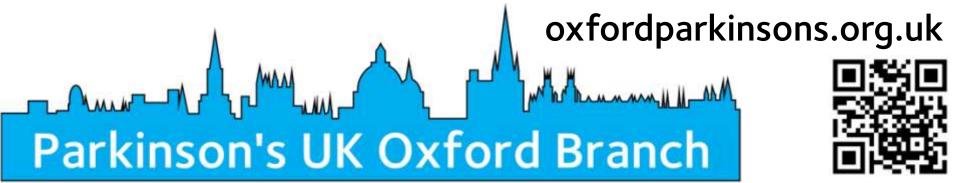

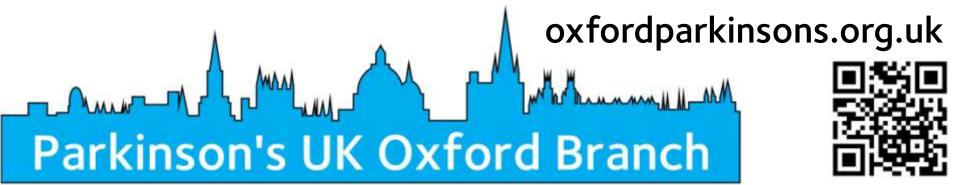

The James Parkinson Bicentennial

#### Patrick Lewis

Two hundred years after apothecary and medical gractitioner James Parkinson whole his essay describing the Shaking Pally, we still don't fully understand the disease named after him. Research into Parkinson's disease is yielding considerate results and treatments are in development. But for the patients and families and friends of those with the condition, many details remain unclear, leading to confusion and occasionally, dismais.

Or Patrick Lewis has been working on Parkatson's disease for many years. He identified the environment of the many as an opportunity to sell the story of the disease, discuss how we understand it today and explain where the latest research is latesting.
